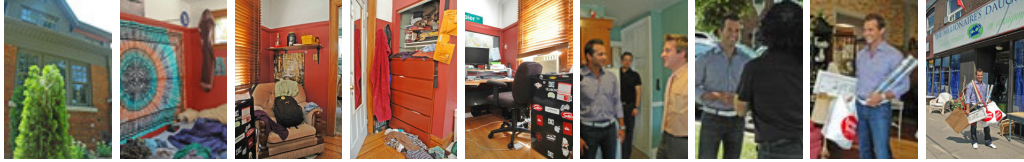


CITY TV's CityLine Comes To Ottawa Street!

lifestyles of small towns, harbours and observed still lifes. Through the use of a cubism style the homes in the towns are layered upon one another to create an endless pattern of geometric shapes. Coombs has taught and inspired his style to many students by teaching at Dundas Valley School of Art, Sheridan College, Loyalist College, and Ontario College of Art and Design, just to name a few. His work has been shown in South Korea and throughout Ontario.


As an invaluable instructor at Mohawk College, Wayne Moore's work illustrates the importance of an artist intimately knowing their medium and subject matter. Moore's paintings use thin layers of acrylic paint to complicate the study of a woman's body. The refractions of light and multiple angles, at which one can study the body, are all transcribed onto one canvas. Moore's work will constantly keep they eye in motion. His work can be found in corporate and private collections in Canada, United States, Mexico, England, the Netherlands, and Japan.

These visionary instructors have inspired students and onlookers with their complex imagery and perfected execution. Earls Court Gallery welcomes all to join us on Thursday August 26, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. until 9:30 p.m. to open the show and meet some of the artists.

ART IN PUBLIC PLACES... on Ottawa Street!



Ottawa Street is now home to its first public art piece located in East Kiwanis Place.

In 2008 the City of Hamilton Culture Division undertook a public art competition to select a piece of public art to be located in East Kiwanis Place on Ottawa Street North at the corner of Edinburgh Avenue.

Artist **Daniel Davelaar's** proposed sculpture the 'Dressmaker's Manikin with Drapery' was selected from eleven submissions by a jury of local business people, citizens and artists. The 3 m (10'-0") high sculpture is modelled on a local seamstress's manikin draped in cloth in such a way as to recall classical Roman and Greek sculpture. It is to be carved from a single block of Mountain Rose Granite.

The artist began work in the fall of 2008. The series of images below illustrate the progress of the work.
